

On Thursday 12 and Friday 13 May, the first public workshop of the [ANR REACT project \(ANR-20-CE28-0012\)](#) will take place in Paris. This project focuses on 'reactive practices': the practices we engage in when facing wrongness, such as punishment, blame, shame and forgiveness. We examine the differences and similarities between these practices and the 'reactive attitudes' theorised by Strawson in *Freedom and Resentment* (1962); their misuse and, in particular, their effects in terms of stigmatisation, marginalisation and discrimination; and the ways in which we can correct them. The REACT project has two applied branches: one on addiction in which we reflect on reactive practices towards addicts; a second in which we explore a subset of reactive practices, namely penal responses and, in particular, non-punitive responses. This workshop brings together international experts in moral, political and legal philosophy. They will each, in their own way, explore the notion of reactive practice, its ethical implications, its affective and emotional dimensions, in order to better define it and show its fruitfulness.
